## Note:

- 1. Among the major elective courses offered by each group in each grade, 18 credits of compulsory courses need to be selected.
- 2. Students select a group for major need to take 18 credits of major electives, of which up to 4 credits can be selected for other groups; Students select a group for major and a group for minor need to take 28 credits of major electives, or you can change to 14 or more for major, 8 or more for minor, plus a maximum of 6 credits for each group.
- 3. The compulsory courses of our department and the elective courses of the major and auxiliary majors, except for the courses supported by other departments or not offered by our department, are limited to take the courses offered by our department.
- 4. The compulsory courses for 2<sup>nd</sup> grade of "Comparative Government and Politics", "International Relations" and "Public Administration" are open to 1<sup>st</sup> grade.
- 5. Elective courses that include 2 semesters, and students who want to be listed as major elective credits, must take and pass the courses in the first and next semesters.
- 6. (1) "Administrative Law" offered by the Department of Law can be used to offset "Administrative Law (I \cdot II)" for Public Policy and Administration group of our department.
  - (2) "Public International Law (I \ II) " offered by the Department of Financial and Economic Law can be used to offset " Public International Law (I \ II) " for International Relation group of our department.
  - (3)The major elective of Civil Society group can take "Political Communication" offered by the Department of Communication
- 7. Those who choose the Civil Society Group as a major elective, the 18 credits of major elective courses must include two compulsory courses "political socialization" and "basic concepts of civil society" in order to be recognized as a major elective.
- 8. Courses with the same name in a master's class may be recognized as graduation credits for bachelor's classes, but courses of the same name in the master's program shall not be counted as graduation credits for master's classes in the future.
- 9. If the undergraduate major elective of the department has not set up the course for three years, students can apply to our office during the second stage of each semester (add and drop period), and after the course committee has reviewed and approved, they can go to other departments or for another schools to take courses.
- 10. Free elective is 20 credits for one major or 10 credits for one major and one minor.
  - (1) The free elective credits can choose the elective courses offered by the department (including cross-group major elective courses), as well as courses of other departments.
  - (2) The credits of military training (nursing) courses can be included in the calculation of free elective and graduation points.
  - (3) Select courses offered by other departments with the same name as the compulsory and elective courses of the department can't be included in the calculation of free elective and graduation credits.
  - (4) Extra-taken general education courses can't be counted to free elective and graduation credits. Students who waive credits for educational courses or extra-taken educational courses can't be included in the calculation of free elective and graduation credits.
  - (5) Advanced (intermediate and advanced) courses and basic Japanese language courses (inclusive) courses in the Center for Language Studies Language Center can be included in the free electives of our departments.

- (6) The credits of elective physical education courses for students of our department can be included in the free elective and graduation credits, limited to one credit in each semester.
- ★ Students of this department are required to complete the Social Service Learning Course (compulsory 0 credits) in accordance with "National Chung Cheng University Students' Study Regulations. ", and it is recommended to complete the study before the end of their third year, and should have at least 16 hours of practical service and participate in at least two service learning lecture series.
